Job Description: Graphic Design Volunteer

Reports to: Editor-in-Chief or Deputy Editor

Responsibilities: The Graphic Design Volunteer will design content for marketing, branding, and social media campaigns. Will conceptualize, design, and create mock-ups from small enhancements to entirely new designs. Projects will range from designing social media graphics to participating in large projects to market Social Work Helper.

Essential Duties and Responsibilities: Design clear, engaging graphic communications for print and the web. This may include logos, direct mail pieces, branded promotional items, website and social media graphics, posters, flyers, and other marketing materials as needed. Work closely with the executive staff to translate messaging concepts into marketing materials.

Must have the ability to work independently and in partnership with a team. Must possess the ability to define and work on deadlines. Applicants will also need to be self-directed and willing to take initiative as well as detail-oriented, respect and maintain the confidentiality of Social Work Helper, and possess an enthusiasm for the mission of the organization and/or photography.

Time Commitment: Time dedication is a minimum of five hours per week.
